C I R C U L A R

In the conference of Divisional Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners held on 10th August 1984, many of the Deputy Commissioners shared the Government's concern about the low disposal of remanded cases of Land Reforms by the Land Tribunals. The Deputy Commissioners explained that despite sending the Tahsildars to High Court/Advocate General's Office/Government, they were unable to trace and get back the records.

It is possible that the records summoned, might have been sent to the High Court, Advocate General's Office, Law Department or Revenue Department (Land Reforms Cell).

In order to trace the movement of the records and to arrange for their return to Land Tribunals, definite information is required as to whom the records were sent together with details like Writ Petition Numbers, Land Tribunal Case Numbers, despatch letter number and date, date of receipt of records by the addressee and date of disposal of Writ Petition.

Therefore, all the Secretaries of Land Tribunals, the Tahsildars/Special Tahsildars are requested to send the aforesaid information in the proforma enclosed immediately to Deputy Secretary to Government, Revenue Department (Land Reforms Cell-J) 6th Floor, III Stage, Multistoreyed Building, Dr.Ambedkar Road, Bangalore.1.
