S C I R C U L A R

Sub: Exercise of powers by the Executive Magistracy without fear or favour and absolutely objective and impartial.

-:00:-

The Chief Secretary to the Government of Karnataka has stated in his Confidential D.O.Letter No.DPAR 55 AAR 77(C) dated 25-11-1977 that a few complaints have been received by the Government that the Executive Magistracy during the last visit of Mrs. Indira Gandhi, former Prime Minister of India to the State generally and to Bangalore in particular did not exercise their powers impartially and objectively but tend to favour one party considering the political affiliations of the persons involved.

Government expect the Executive Magistracy to be absolutely objective and impartial in the exercise of their powers ~~xxxxxxx~~ no matter which party is involved and to take action against any one to whichever party he might belong, if his action tends to disturb law and order. The Executive Magistracy must not only be impartial but manifestly appear to be so, so that the public does not lose its confidence in the Executive Magistracy in the least.

All the subordinate officers exercising magisterial powers are requested to bear in mind the intention of Government, as cited above and exercise their magisterial powers in an absolutely objective and impartial manner, without fear or favour of any person or party so that a general impression prevails in the public mind that the Executive Magistracy is exercising its powers most legally and impartially.
